## Abstract:

The rise of China has many effects on science and engineering research, and is also changing international journals. The talk will give an international Editor's perspective how China is changing scientific publishing and research, and include Editor's advice on how Chinese researchers can publish in high-IF journals.

## Introduction:

**Dr. Philip Earis** studied at Cambridge University, UK, where he was a researcher in the physics laboratory. In 2003 he joined the Royal Society of Chemistry (RSC) as an Editor, working on the journal *Physical Chemistry Chemical Physics*. He became the Managing Editor of the journal in 2006. In 2008 Philip created the new journal *Energy & Environmental Science*. In 2009 Philip launched a further new journal, *Nanoscale*. He remains as Managing Editor for *Faraday Discussions*.
